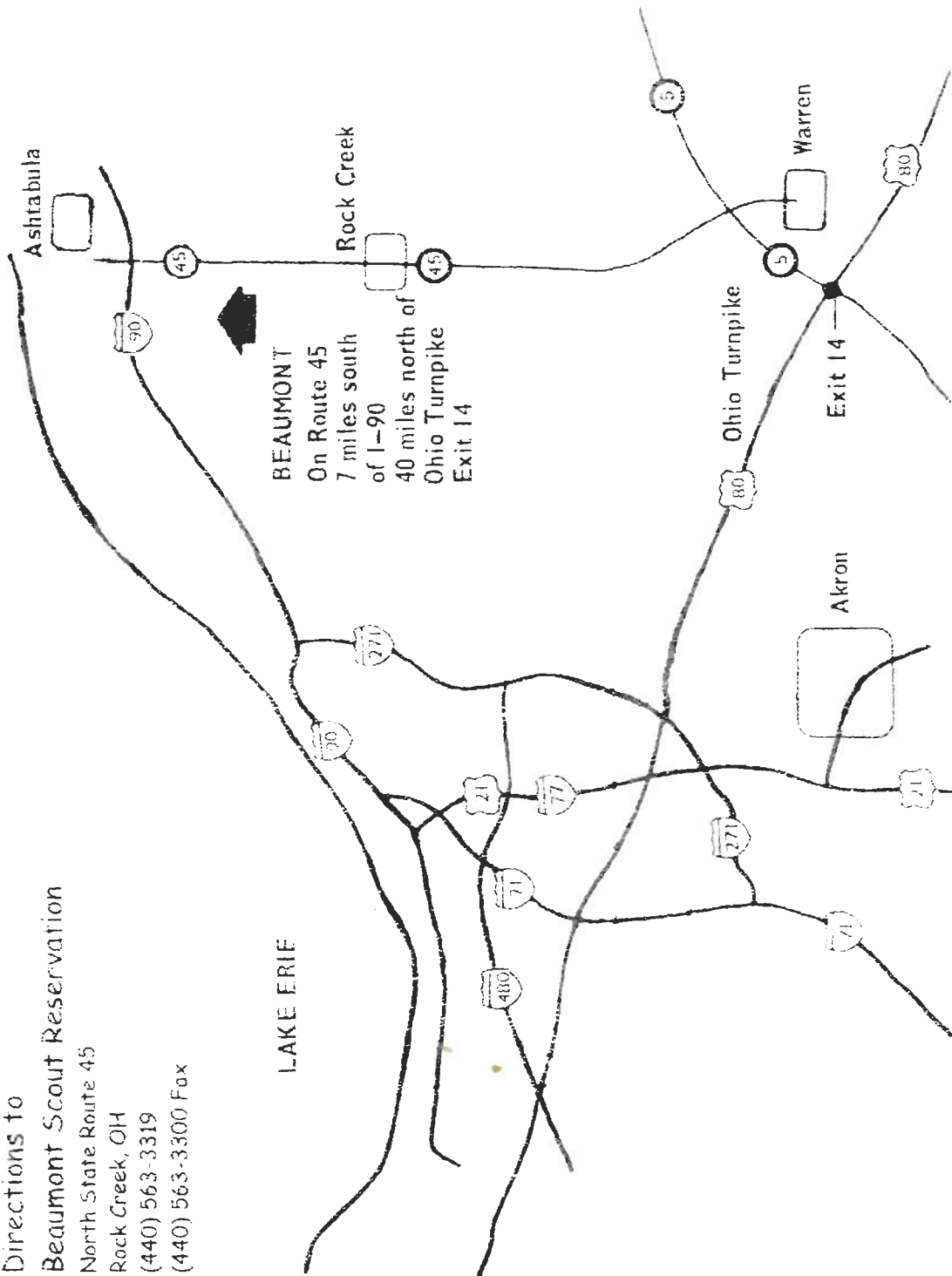

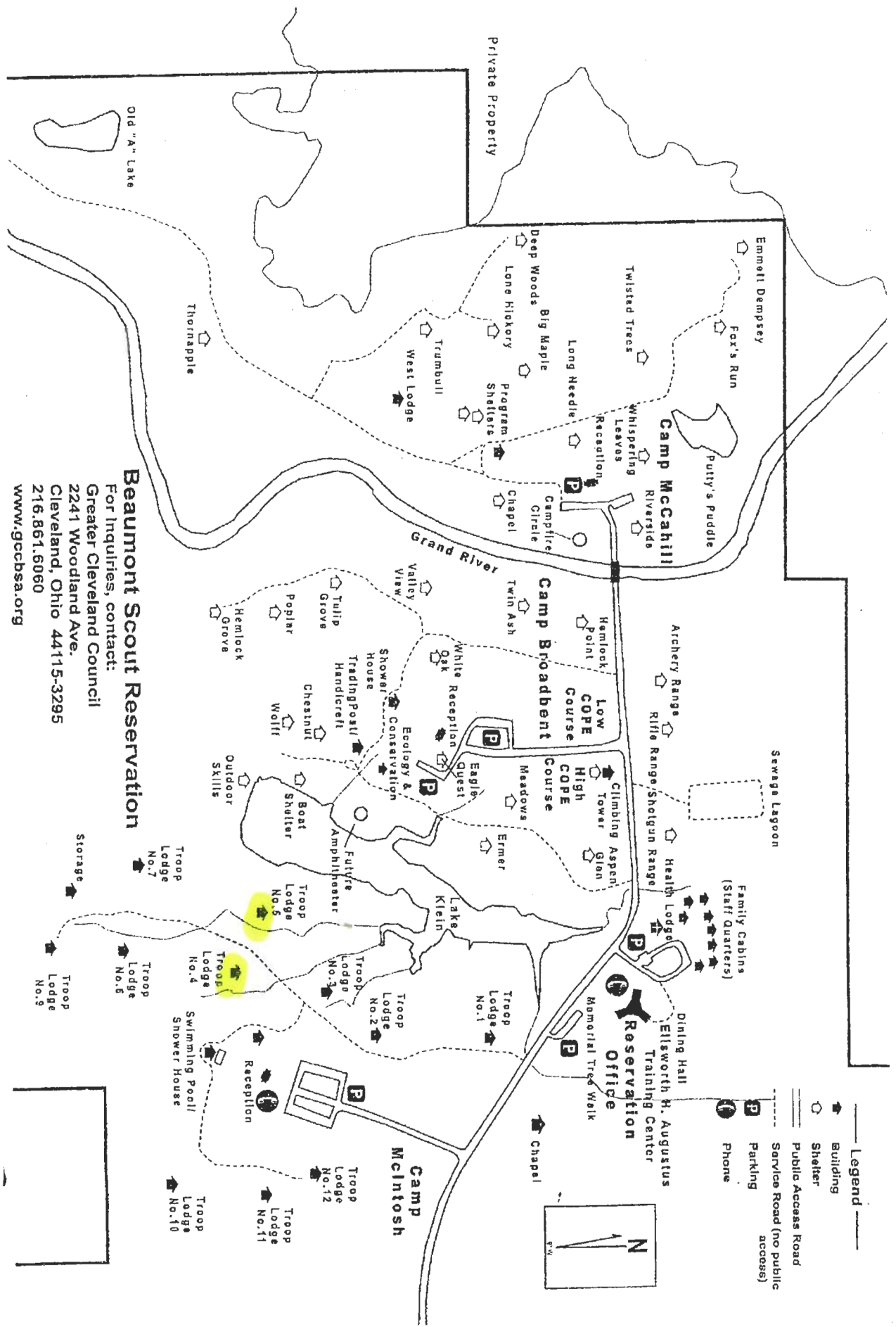

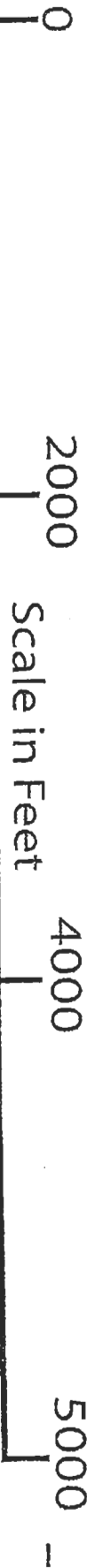

- Snack to share with other scouts (ex. a dozen cookies). These will be put in a communal "snack stash". There will be several snack periods where the snacks will be brought out and shared.
- Pillow & sleeping bag
- Toiletries
- Raincoat or Poncho
- Sweatpants and sweatshirt for sleeping
- Garbage bags (good for muddy clothes, shoes and improvised rain ponchos)
- Bed sheet (mattresses tend to be old and dusty)
- Extra shoes/boots (it may be muddy and we may need "inside" and "outside" footwear), socks.
- Extra clothes – scouts are genetically programmed to seek out dirt and mud.

Other Stuff

- Frisbee, football, soccer ball, other outdoor play equipment
- Special items for self (medication if needed)
- A game that can be played by other scouts if the weather is bad (Deck of Cards)
- Lawn Chair
- Umbrella
- Flashlight, batteries
- Earplugs (some Dads snore louder than others).
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DO NOT BRING FIRE WOOD FROM HOME

WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT NOT TO BRING (BE PREPARED)

- ___ DUFFEL/BACKPACK/SPORTS BAG for your stuff. Line it with a garbage bag to keep dry.
- ___ SLEEPING BAG. The bunks have foam mats, your choice to bring something else/more.
- ___ PILLOW or stuff your extras into your duffel to make a pillow if you prefer.
- ___ WARM OUTSIDE COAT and possible a light jacket or vest for in/around the cabin.
- ___ WARM HAT AND GLOVES/MITTENS Wear hat when sleeping if cold.
- ___ RAINCOAT Your choice, be prepared.
- ___ BOOTS Tall, dry and leak-proof are best. In addition to shoes.
- ___ SHOES For primary wear in the cabins, so we can leave muddy boots at the door.
- ___ EXTRA CHANGE OF CLOTHES (pants, shirt-long and short, underwear and socks-extra)
- ___ SWEATS, LONG JOHNS, ETC. Wear when sleeping if you get cold at night.
- ___ WHATEVER MEDICINE/MEDICAL ITEMS YOU AND YOUR BOY WILL NEED (this includes packing your own Advil/Tylenol or the like)
- ___ 1-2 WATER BOTTLES, filled. Keep with you for hike, etc. Your own soda if you must have.
- ___ FLASHLIGHT & EXTRA BATTERIES
- ___ PEN/PENCIL & POCKET NOTEPAD
- ___ CLEAN-UP KIT (small hand soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb, floss, camp towel, toilet paper-half a roll in a Zip-Loc bag, etc.) No showers available.
- ___ MUST BRING 12 COOKIES in a zip-loc for the community cookie jar for deserts, etc. A FEW SMALL SNACKS for yourself, healthy please. Raisins or energy bars for the hike, etc.
- ___ CAMERA and any other equipment you may want, such as binoculars.
- ___ EAR PLUGS and sleeping pills for dad (in case the guy next to you snores).
- ___ CARDS, GAMES, OTHER FUN HANDS-ON THINGS Other things to show/share/do.
- ___ LUMBER SCRAPS FOR THE STOVE No regular firewood due to Emerald Ash Borer. Bow saw or small hatchet if you are collecting fire wood (boys are not to use these tools).

NO need to bring: Large amounts of food (unless you plan not to eat camp food), anything really dangerous, sheath knife, large ax, chainsaw, alcohol (sorry dads – absolutely no), electronic entertainment (this is an outdoor weekend).

We recommend no knives for boys and absolutely no knives for boys w/o Whittle-n-Chip training.

ACTIVITIES

Hike – after breakfast, go until about lunch time (e.g., 930AM to about 12noon)

Alphabet Hike if you want - Find various items with names that begin with each letter of the alphabet. If you want an additional challenge, go in order from A to Z. See sheet. See how many or how far you can get in the alphabet. Possible prize.

The hike permits people to “bail-out.” The hike is a general loop around the camp. About halfway, we will be around the Chapel area. To bail out, head South, through parking lot, and field to get to cabins. The bail out may be good for our younger scouts. The younger scouts can do a word search or color at the cabins until the rest return.

The hike will go clockwise around the camp, stop at the bird sanctuary visitor center, go to the North edge, past pond and possibly the Cub Scout challenge course.

Cub Scout Olympics (1:30PM to 3PM) Possible prizes.

Tug of war Divide into two teams (boys only). Everyone picks from a container of numbered paper slips or colored tooth picks in a bag

Relay races Divide into teams, perhaps 4 teams. Divide as above

Others, e.g., pass/punt/kick, Frisbee competition, etc. (time permitting)

Scavenger hunt (3PM to 4:30PM, see sheet) Dad and son teams. Buddy teams or Den teams. Possible prizes.

Dad and son/buddy time (4:30PM to 6PM) You must plan and bring something to do. Work on items in the cub book, fly a kite, catch a fish, do a collection, etc. You must be with your son (unless your son is with a buddy/another dad because of your work task)

possible ideas for dad and son time or other time/back-up:

Animal track hunt and plaster casting (especially good for older scouts) Try to find deer (look on a trail), raccoon, skunk, opossum and mink (look near water, especially a stream) tracks.

Rock/leaf collection Every rock/leaf in your collection must be a different type, look along water, especially a stream

Bird watch/count Go for a walk, make a list of the different species and the number seen, bring some binoculars

Indoor game time after dinner (7PM-8PM) Everyone takes a breather in the cabin after dinner. Bring a game (e.g., board game (e.g., Trouble, Sorry), card game (Uno, Go fish), Dominos, Texas hold'em or something else. No electronics. Boy break into groups of their choice for the games.

Possible twilight owl prowl, turkey roost and deer viewing (7:30PM-8:15PM) A walk to look for feeding deer and listen for an owl or turkey.

Campfire (8PM to 10PM) Bring a chair for yourself. If someone wants to do a song, story, or skit, please prepare now and please put on your show. Popcorn for a snack.

Back-up/Time filler/Indoor (foul weather):

Knot tying clinic. We will have some rope for learning knots

Leaf rubbings, what the boys collect

20 questions, via walkie-talkies between cabins

“i spy” in the cabin

Word search/crossword puzzle

Coloring (for younger scouts or as overall back-up)

Boys in groups to do skits, need not be by dens
